The extended format of this year's Biennnial as well as parts of its public program have been developed in partnership with "Timişoara—Capitală Europeană a Culturii" Association and are co-financed by the Ministry of Culture and National Identity and the Timişoara City Hall.

The Biennial is seeking to create a space of dialog between artists, publics, institutions and ideas through a wide-ranging program of art exhibitions, debates, workshops, performances and art in public space.

Curators: Maria Lind & Anca Rujoiu

For the third edition of The Art Encounters Biennial in Timişoara, a series of contextsensitive commissions approach contemporary art as a form of understanding which, along with science, politics, and philosophy, helps us tackle the complexity of life today. Curators Maria Lind and Anca Rujoiu have paired artworks and practices with situations, locations, and questions, placing them alongside existing works embedded in the landscape and history of Timişoara. The Biennial's name,

Art Encounters, acts as further inspiration for discussion and reflection. Each artwork is the product of encounters, and aims to find and develop contact and conflict zones with groups and individuals around the art.

Over the course of the one-year long 2019 edition of the Art Encounters Biennial, different thoughts and ideas flow through artworks and practices, influencing this part of the project. Similar to the winds in Herta Müller's novels, which take place in and around Timişoara and have different connotations, the winds of the Biennial bring various temperatures, ambiances, and even substances. Winds blow through borders and translations, something well known in Timişoara's Banat region, including the edges of visibility and invisibility. Another wind drives an attention to craft and the work of the hand. A third wind stimulates independent publishing, personal collections, and forms of self-organisation.

Starting by inviting around twenty artists whose practice the curators found strong and immediate to make new work, patterns emerged—the winds—which led to forty more artists being invited with existing works. The existing works emphasize, complicate and problematize the winds. These works are spread out in more than thirty locations in Timisoara and beyond, including online, as clusters and as individual presentations.

### The Whole and Its Parts

#### →Biennial Talks

These presentations are part of a monthly talk series with artists and other cultural agents participating in the Art Encounters Biennial 2019. The talks take place between January and October 2019 and are organized in collaboration with local institutions (the Faculty of Arts and Design, the Faculty of Architecture and City Planning in Timişoara), independent organizations (La Două Bufnițe, Spațiul 2/2) and financial partners. #### →Workshops

Each workshop is led by Biennial artists and other cultural agents involved in this edition, and is driven by a specific inquiry or production process as part of their contribution to the Biennial. The workshop series was inaugurated in February with a performative workshop conceived by Mădălina Zaharia. It was followed in March by a workshop on art production, led by cultural producer Justin O'Shaughnessy, organized in partnership with Timișoara 2021—European Capital of Culture, and continued with a textile workshop led by Iulia Toma. Further workshops were led by Mona Vătămanu & Tudor Florin, Matts Leiderstam, and Želimir Žilnik.

#### →Volunteer Program

The volunteer program is addressed to students and young graduates interested in engaging in the research, production and mediation stages of the Biennial. The program entails a direct exchange with the artists, curators and the Art Encounters team, as well as an opportunity to learn and be part of the multi-layered process of this Biennial.



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#### →Screenings

Film and video screenings take place throughout the year in collaboration with various partners: Želimir Žilnik in partnership with the film festival Ceau Cinema!; The Otolith Group, Irina Botea Bucan & Jon Dean, and Metahaven with the Timişoara National Theatre, part of a selection of moving-image works of a theatrical nature. On Saturday afternoons, starting during the opening weekend in the main auditorium of the "Mihai Eminescu" National Theatre, the artists are invited for a conversation with the curators on stage after the screening. A screening of Gülsün Karamustafa, Chto delat, and Anton Vidokle's films will take place at the Attic of the Faculty of Arts and Design in Timişoara.

#### →The Biennial Exhibition

Being a cross between a biennial and a festival, the 2019 edition of the Art Encounters Biennial is a sprawling phenomenon, taking place across more than thirty locations in the city, the region and online over the entire year. Rather than looking for "new discoveries" in terms of buildings and sites, the curators opted for existing infrastructure and other environments which give meaning to the work in question.

There are clusters of works in both designated exhibition spaces and in other settings. Some art works are developed on site by the artists, others have been embedded in specific contexts by the initiative of the curators. Art is both indoors and outdoors, in public space, private space, and between them. These different parts make up the multifaceted whole. There is no theme, but a methodology, an approach centered on art.

#### →Independent Publishing Platform with Collective Readings

Highlighting the field of independent publishing in all its diversity, several local, regional and national independent publishers and distributors are invited to take part in the platform and present their publications alongside a showcase of artists' books. The three components of this platform are: the collective reading sessions, the presentation of art books published by independent initiatives, and a display of artists' books.

The participants in the collective reading program are: Ana Bilbao, editorial collective of Cutra Adriana Gheorghe, Delia Grigore, Radu Pavel Gheo, Timea Junghaus, and Leah Whitman Salkin. The series of collective readings is grounded on the merits of the communal production of meaning and a diversity of reading methods and materials. Projects by Tatiana Fiodorova and Nicoleta Moise will be on display. Both artists engage with archives, and they present the book as an artistic medium in its own right.

#### →Autumn School of Curating

The Art Encounters Foundation and the Cluj Cultural Center have joined forces in organizing the first edition of the Autumn School of Curating, taking place in Cluj and Timișoara 20—27 October 2019, marking the closing weekend of Art Encounters Biennial 2019. Having the writer Joanna Warsza as the leading curator of the course, the school proposes the format of Conversation as a main platform for dialogue, knowledge exchange, and learning tool. Over the course of one week, participants from Romania and elsewhere engage in the artistic context that the two cities have to offer, in activities around the theory and practice of speech and dialogue.





#### →Publication

Conceived as a reader, the publication documents the Biennial's year-long program. In addition to texts on the artworks, there are conversations with the participating artists, and essays by Andrea Phillips, Boris Buden and Daria Ghiu elaborating on the thematic of "winds" which blew through the biennial. The introduction by curators Anca Rujoiu and Maria Lind outlines their curatorial approach, including the "winds": borders and translation, self-organization, work of the hand and the limits of visibility and invisibility. Photographic documentation and floor plans included in the publication record the making of the exhibition, conveying how the placement and interactions between the works were conceived in space and across the city.

#### The Art Museum, Timișoara, Unirii Square 1 Magdalena Abakanowicz (1930—2017): Presence, Essence, Identity.

Curator: Maria Rus Bojan Co-curator: Cristina Bută Organiser: The Interart Triade Foundation September 20—October 25 **Opening:** Thursday, September 19, 2019, 6 PM One of the most acclaimed Polish artists on the world art scene, Magdalena Abakanowicz gained her international notoriety in the 1960's for her experimental, and highly uncommon at the time, gigantic fiber sculptures entitled generically *Abakans*. The fluid woven structures made of organic materials significantly expanded the traditional meaning of sculpture, transforming the flat surface of a tapestry into a dynamic space-organized form that triggers complex visual and tactile experiences. Featuring more than 100 sculptures, the exhibition aims to provide an understanding of the major issues in Abakanowicz's work, and to illustrate the ways in which she revolutionized the history of sculpture through a lifelong commitment to constant reinvention.
